A LETTER FROM OUR CEO

Help. It was the most powerful email of my 2023, because of that one simple word. *Help.*

It was written by a mother who needed food for her little ones, and she emailed me out of desperation looking for help. Thanks to you, we are there for her, feeding her children and thousands of others.

We had a historic year in 2023, crossing over the 2 million meals made and delivered threshold for the first time in our 17-year history with more than 2.4 million meals lovingly placed into the hands of hungry little ones. I couldn't be more full of gratitude for you, our volunteers, donors and partners who make this vital work possible.

Did you know that the average restaurant serves about 78,000 meals a year? You and our devoted volunteer workforce make millions of meals possible at a fraction of the cost. I am thrilled to say we again were able to keep our annual average meal cost at \$2 per meal landed. Our team is focused on efficiency and our DEI efforts continue with a Board lead, staff and Board training, and we created a Family Advisory Board comprised of families receiving meals across the city to seek their invaluable feedback. I am proud that our commitment to diversity is woven into every part of this organization.

Looking forward to 2024, our goal is to make and deliver 2.7 million meals and host more than 25,000 volunteers in-house and another 20,000 out in the community. The latest projections indicate upwards of 80,000 preschool-aged children in Houston live food-insecure.

Our Building Hope Capital Campaign is creating a path for our goal of feeding 26,000 children a day by 2031. We broke ground in first quarter of 2024, a significant step towards ending childhood hunger in Houston.

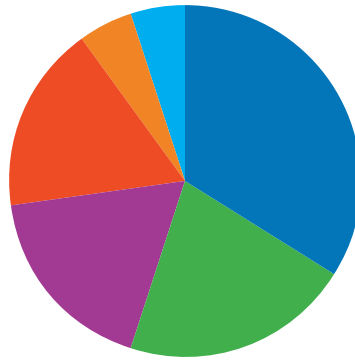

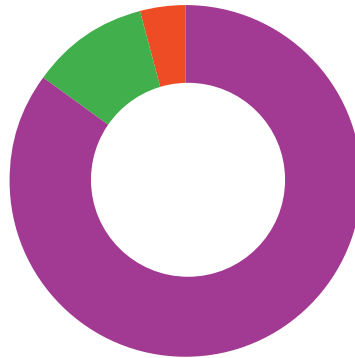

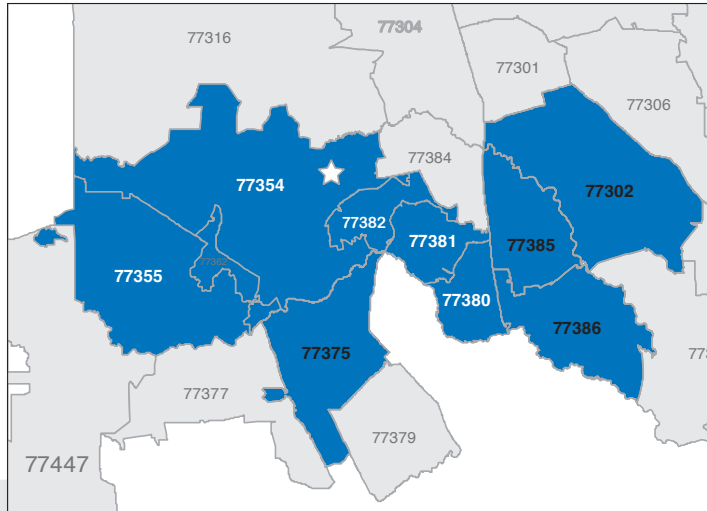

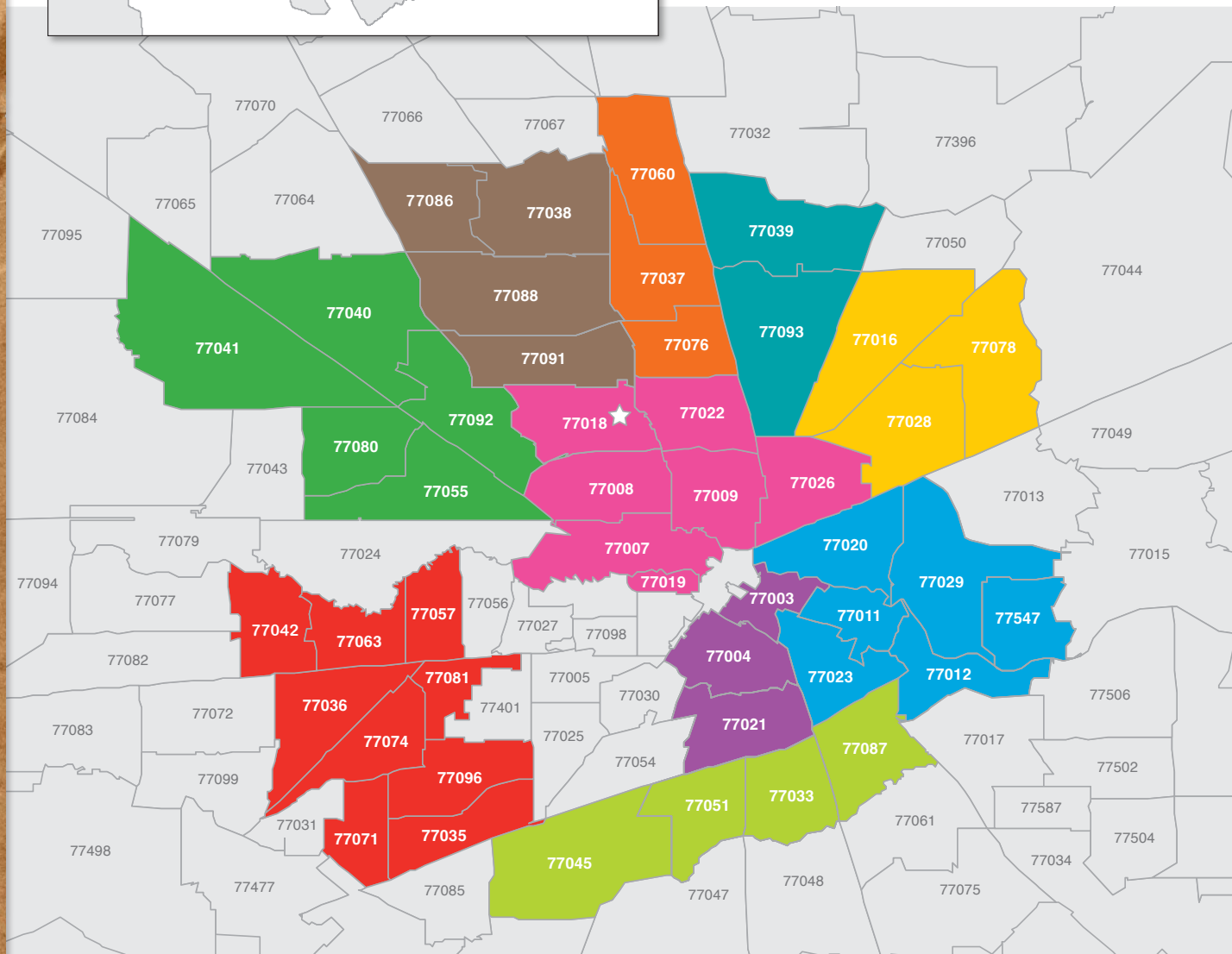

☆ Kids' Meals locations



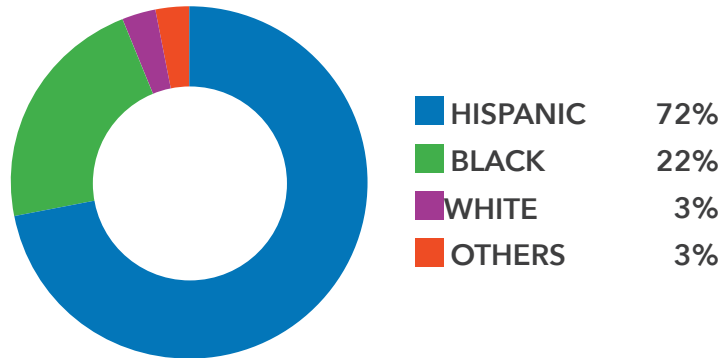
Preschool-Aged Children Served in 2023

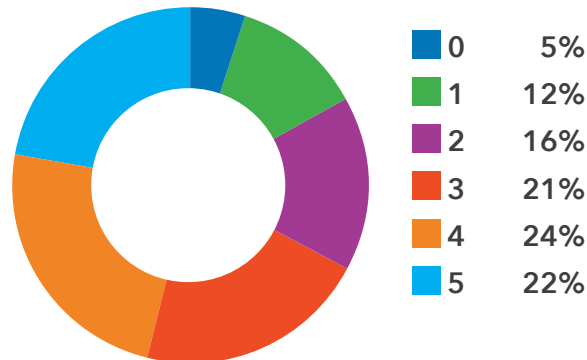

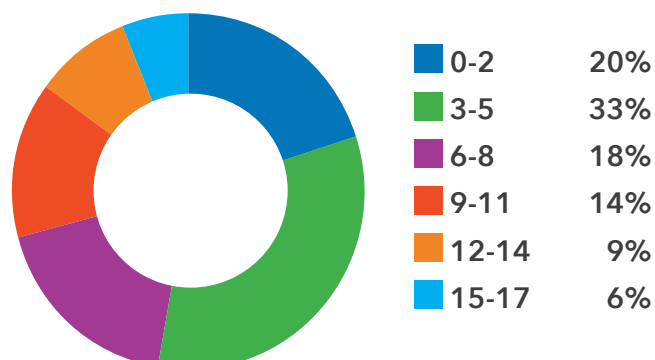
Demographics ► Children in our Program

CELEBRATING ONE YEAR OF IMPACT IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY

In 2023, we celebrated the first anniversary since we extended our campus to Montgomery County, and we are excited to share the amazing achievements we have accomplished together.

- **Dedication to Daily Delivery:** Our Montgomery County location delivered an average of 434 meals every weekday.
- **109,017 Meals Delivered in 2023:** You made it possible to deliver over 109,017 meals to hungry children in Montgomery County in 2023.
- **7,587 Volunteer Hours Given in 2023:** Healthy meals are made by dedicated volunteers who give their precious time to feed hungry children in Montgomery County.

BUILDING HOPE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Kids' Meals' Building Hope Capital Campaign is an endeavor that has garnered unprecedented support from donors across the entire city of Houston. The success of this initiative owes much to the dedicated efforts of Capital Campaign Chair, Earl Hesterberg, Building Campaign Chair, Wyatt Hogan, the entire Campaign Cabinet, and our many generous donors who are making this project possible.

Facility Expansion Imperative

Over the past 17 years, Kids' Meals has operated out of leased spaces. Regrettably, we have outgrown our current facilities, facing constraints in food storage, volunteer space, and parking. This inefficiency impedes our ability to achieve the organizational goal of producing and delivering 26,000 meals daily by 2031. In response, our Board of Directors has deemed it imperative to pursue the design and construction of a purpose-built facility.

Addressing Food Insecurity Challenges

The stark reality of food insecurity, particularly among children in Harris County, as highlighted by Feeding America's 2020 study, underscores the urgency of our mission. Recent studies from Texas Children's Hospital and the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities illuminate the lasting economic impact of the pandemic on struggling families, especially those with children of color. With at least 80,000 preschool-aged children in our area facing food insecurity, our ambitious goal is to "Build Hope" by feeding 26,000 a day by 2031 while fortifying our organizational infrastructure.

Building Hope Campaign Progress

In 2023, we entered *Phase II* of the Building Hope Campaign, with the objective to raise \$22 million to construct a 50,000 square foot, purpose-built campus on five strategically designed acres. Notable achievements include the completion of Phase I in 2021, the acquisition of property in Spring Branch, and the full payment of associated loans. Presently in Phase II, we have raised nearly \$16 million toward the \$22 million construction goal.

The Mabee Foundation Challenge

On October 10, 2023, the Mabee Foundation granted Kids' Meals a challenge gift of \$2 million to finish the campaign. To unlock these funds, the campaign must secure an additional \$5 million in cash and pledges by October 10, 2024, and we are well on our way to accomplishing that goal.

Strategic Partnerships and Project Timeline

Kids' Meals enlisted the services of Kirksey Architects, Pin Oak Interests for project management, Satterfield & Pontikes as the general contractor, and Pappas Restaurants, contributing significant in-kind expertise. A groundbreaking and site work are slated to commence in March 2024.
